Archaeology Detectives at Home

Archaeology Collections Volunteers, Joyce and Matthew have been using their detective skills investigating mystery objects and deciphering Roman stamps.

Many of the Archaeology Volunteer projects rely on working in person with objects housed on site, and it has proved difficult to finds tasks that could easily be done at home during lockdown. However, for objects that have been photographed there has been scope to undertake research.

Matthew deciphered and researched the stamps on some of our Roman Samian ware pottery. He discovered



one was made by the potter Sacrillus of Lezoux (stamp 'SACRILLIM') who worked from AD 165-200. Some of Sacrillus's pots have been found at forts on Hadrian's Wall!

Joyce was tasked with finding out more about a stone plaque engraved 'St Mary's Terrace 1860'. She used online maps, photographs and directories,

and found what we believe to be a photograph of the plaque in situ


Our Market, Our Fair!

To do this we need your help!


We want the sounds to reflect the diverse communities living in our county and to be accessible and relatable to as many people as possible including you and the people closest to you.
