Environmental Focus – 23/24 Cultural & Natural Heritage

This year, young people in projects across the county have been exploring natural and cultural heritage linked to the environment, sustainability and climate change. Their projects will help inform future plans for Net Zero Leicestershire.

25 young people have joined Cultural Youth Forum projects at our Market Town Museums and Libraires in Melton Mowbray, Market Harborough and Loughborough.

- > 50 adults & 30 young people & children attended the event
- ➤ 4 young people signed up to join the Cultural Youth Forum
- Inspired primary school aged children to get involved with the conversation
- > 20 young people completed a climate change survey
- Brought in new museum visitors

Cultural Youth Forum – Youth Voice

Young People across our Cultural Youth Forum projects, with support from LCC's Carbon Reduction Team, have developed a Young Person Environmental Survey for 11-24 year olds living in Leicestershire.

"We are Leicestershire County Council's Cultural Youth Forum, and we would like the views of young people aged 11-24 years living in Leicestershire on how to make the environment better. This will help shape and inform future plans for Net Zero Leicestershire.

Your feedback and ideas from this survey will be used to help develop Leicestershire County Council's engagement plan, which is designed to educate and encourage Leicestershire residents to take positive climate action. We would like to hear how you think individuals and communities could step up to the climate emergency challenge."

The Cultural Youth Forum have given themselves a target of 1,000 completed surveys by 31st March 2024!

Outputs, Targets and Success Measures

• We have established a Culture Youth Forum to specifically support our work with young people, develop our collections and nurture the museum and library professionals of the future. We have held our first cross-county sharing events.

Ambition and Quality

- Within 12 months We have launched the Cultural Youth Forum
- Next step > to invite our two inspirational leaders to join the NPO Board to guide the programme and ensure project focus

Environmental Responsibility

• **3 year ambition** - We have embedded Environmental and Net Zero Strategies into our work with young people in our Cultural Youth which is enabling staff, Creative Practitioners, participants and volunteers to make their contribution. We have widened our ambition by giving a voice to young people across the county and giving them the opportunity to inform and shape Leicestershire's net zero strategy.

Dynamism

- We have begun capturing data for the Cultural Youth Forum projects & events using Illuminate & Snap impact surveys.
- We have worked with Business Intelligence to develop young people surveys.
- We record community curators hours which are included in tableau data.

Inclusivity and Relevance

 We have started to embed the practice of community collaboration, co-design and delivery throughout the Cultural Youth Forum by gathering young people's views, connecting with under represented groups, involving young people in panel recruitment of practitioners and letting them lead on events / activities within our venues.
